12th ANNUAL METLIFE CLUB TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFYING

RULES FOR SCRAMBLE

This competition is governed by the 2008-2009 USGA Rules of Golf except as modified by the following Local Rules & Definitions.

1. The format shall be a two-person scramble. The Championship Flight is gross only. The other flights will be determined by total team handicap index. To determine the net score, the AGA uses 40% of the total team index.
 - a) Championship Flight - 6,500-6,900 yds
 - b) Gross & Net Flights – 6,200-6,500 yds (Teams are scored in both the gross & net categories.)
 - c) Super Senior Flight – 5,600-6,000 yds. (The minimum age requirement for this flight is 70.)
2. Each team member must use a minimum of six tee shots.
3. The order in which a team hits can be varied according to the strategy of the team.
4. Each team member plays a ball from the teeing ground on each hole. The shot is selected, marked and then each player plays a ball as follows:
 - a) through the green (rough to fairway & vice versa) within one club length not nearer the hole and not on a putting green
 - b) if selected ball is in a hazard, both balls must be played from within that hazard
 - c) on the putting green from within one putter head length of the original position not nearer the hole.

The ball may be placed or dropped and is considered in play when a stroke at it has been made. The best position is again selected until a ball is holed, completing play.
5. The score of the first ball holed, even if by mistake, will count.
6. If the selected ball is in a hazard, both balls must be played from within that hazard.
7. The position of each selected ball should be marked when lifted. Rule 20.
8. Team members may not stand behind one another (on an extension of the line of play) while they are hitting a shot or putt.
9. Ties for flight winners shall be determined by matching scorecards per Appendix I of the 2008-2009 USGA Rules of Golf. Since this is a shotgun the reference to last nine holes will apply to holes 10 through 18. If the teams are still tied after this USGA procedure, the same method will be applied to holes 1 through 9.
10. If it is necessary to suspend play due to inclement weather or darkness, qualifying teams will be determined relative to par, both gross and net.
