

March 18, 2022 PWGA General Membership Meeting

Vote- Sally Coffin called the meeting to order at 12:31pm and welcomed everyone. Sally introduced the proposed slate of officers.

Rules- Karen explains casual water is when water hits the golfer's shoe. Move the ball to the nearest point of relief, no closer to the pin and choose a spot within 1 club length.

If the ball is touching the rake, if you move the rake and your ball moves, it needs to be placed back in original position, no penalty. If the ball will not stay at rest, move the ball to the nearest place it will not move, no closer to the pin. If you don't want to hit a bunker shot, take your ball out of the bunker, it is a 2 stroke penalty.

Papago Golf Update- The golf course will not be closed this summer during renovations, as temporary greens will be used. PWGA asked to fluff up the sand traps, also improve the drop zone on hole 11. Daryl explains the bunkers need to be redone.
